Upon recommendation from the treasurer it was agreed that the £50 entry fee to the Six Counties Championship would be waived for 1997.

League Report - unavailable. A couple of counties said that they had not received their final result sheet but this seems to have been a postal hiccup and the other counties had had theirs. Suffolk reign supreme in the Eastern Counties having won the Six Counties Championship, The Team Bowl and the League. It was emphasied that all host captains must return the league results sheet promptly to enable a league organiser to issue correct league tables. Proposals

 from Hertfordshire "that the Triples now be included in the ECCBA Championship of Champions" - unanimously passed

Bedfordshire had experienced some difficulty with Light measures in the past season and therefore the following was agreed "a non-playing home captain or designated person shall be nominated at the start of a match to be referee in the event of a disputed measure'.

The 1997 Six Counties Championship is to be held at Littleport. Further details will follow later.

Team Bowl. Cambridgeshire requested that members of the same county could play on adjoining mats rather than being dispersed. Host county for 1998, Bedfordshire, will liase with Cambridgeshire re running order.

Championship of Champions 1997. Essex reminded all counties of their obligation to bring raffle prizes.

Hertfordshire felt that more meetings were required than just the AGM. It was agreed to hold another meeting in September.

Triples Championship. Mrs Southgate reported unhappiness from two quarters about some wording in the triples programme. The secretary apologised if any offence had been caused and would be putting the apology into writing.

It was decided to adopt the following formula for league matches, as previously discussed at the meeting in September 1996. The idea being that in 1998/9 we start at Line 1, 1999/2000 Line 2 etc. Thereby ensuring meeting differing counties at different times each year.
